

ACCUPLACER Multi-Factor Authentication Frequently Asked Questions

This document addresses common questions about ACCUPLACER® Multi-Factor Authentication (MFA) including who it affects, how it works and what to expect during setup.

1. What is MFA?

MFA is a security process that requires users to confirm their identity in more than one way before accessing a system.

2. When will MFA be implemented?

MFA will launch January 26, 2026. All ACCUPLACER and TSIA2 users except for the Webservice user role must be fully enrolled and using MFA by May 1, 2026.

3. Why is MFA being introduced?

MFA enhances security by protecting sensitive test administration data and preventing unauthorized access. This ensures ACCUPLACER testing remains secure, reliable, and trustworthy for educators and students.

4. Who will be affected by MFA?

- All ACCUPLACER and TSIA2 users (except for the Webservice user role) will be required to use MFA login.
- Webservice Users: Not subject to MFA
- Students: Not subject to MFA. Student testing remains unaffected.

5. How does MFA work for users?

When logging in, users will:

- Enter their username and password.
- Receive a one-time passcode via email or text.
- Enter that passcode to complete login.

6. How will users be guided through setup?

During your **first login after MFA rollout in January**, you'll be guided step by step to set up your MFA preferences (email or SMS for one-time passcodes). You may choose not to enroll immediately after launch; however, you will be prompted to do so each time you log in and must complete enrollment no later than **May 1, 2026**.

7. Do I need to set up MFA for every device I use?

No. MFA is linked to your ACCUPLACER account, not your device.

This means:

- You can log in from any computer or testing machine.
- As long as you use your ACCUPLACER credentials, your MFA will follow you.

8. Does MFA affect students?

No. Students won't use MFA.

- The testing process for students remains unchanged.
- Actions like logging students back in after "Save and Finish Later" or a network interruption aren't impacted by MFA.

9. How often will I need to re-authenticate with MFA?

Users must re-authenticate every **90 days** to maintain security.

10. What should I do now?

In advance of the January 2026 launch, take a moment to make sure your ACCUPLACER user profile has an accurate email address and mobile number (if you'd like to receive passcodes by text).

To check your profile:

- 1. Log in to ACCUPLACER.
- 2. Click your name in the upper right-hand corner and select **Profile**.
- 3. Expand the **Demographic Information** section and verify or update your email address and mobile phone number.

This guick step will ensure your MFA setup goes smoothly when the time comes.
